Super Storm Sandy Projects:

Public Works Building Reconstruction

The Reconstruction of the Public Works Building includes new carpeting, electrical wiring and receptacles, low voltage wiring, insulation, sheet rock, trim, flood doors, painting, HVAC units, and hot water heater. Mitigation of the Public Works Building involves the installation of three (3) propane heaters, flood-proofing the building, and elevating the two (2) furnaces, condensation pumps, hot water heater, and HVAC system. The project is currently 99% complete. Currently planning the office space reconfiguration to include record retention.

Seaside Park Marina Reconstruction

The project consists of reconstruction of the Seaside Park Marina. The Marina was flooded with up to 48 inches of bay water in addition to the wave action driven by strong south winds. Reconstruction includes repair of damaged piles, joists, decking, potable water hook-ups, electrical hook-ups and power distribution panel breakers, underground. The project is currently 99% complete.

Boardwalk Reconstruction

The project consists of the reconstruction of the ocean-front Boardwalk. The reconstruction includes removing the damaged sections of boardwalk decking, joints, girders, and railing. Once the damaged boardwalk items are removed a new support system will replace the damaged portions and new boardwalk decking will be installed. The railing system will be replaced in the areas that sustained damage. In addition the equipment loading ramp and handicap ramps from the street to the boardwalk and the boardwalk to the beach are to be reconstructed, where they were damaged. The project is currently 95% complete.

Well No. 8 Electrical System Repairs

The project consists of the necessary repairs to the electrical accessories that were submerged in salt water and a new generator and transformer. Mitigation of Well No. 8 Building involves flood-proofing the building and elevating the step-down transformer. The project is currently 95% complete.

Well No. 10 Electrical System Repairs

The project consists of the necessary repairs to the electrical accessories that were submerged in salt water and a new generator and transformer. Mitigation at the Well No. 10 Building involves flood-proofing the building and elevating the step-down transformer. The project is currently 85% complete.

Reconstruction of the Oceanfront Sand Dunes

Reconstruction of the Oceanfront Sand Dunes consists of placing snow fence and planting dune grass to minimize erosion and to allow the natural replenishment of the sand dunes. The project is currently 75% complete.

Reconstruction of the Seaside Park Bathhouse

The reconstruction is to include sand and debris removal from the interior of the bathhouse. Once that is completed the bathhouse will be power washed and have new sanitary lines. Garage doors, roof fascia, electrical wiring and receptacles, windows, hot water heater installed, service counters built, and water closets replaced or repaired, as well as stucco repair on the exterior of the building. A Structural Engineer shall certify the buildings stability. The project is currently 70% complete.



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Reconstruction of Public Parks

The O Street Park consists of replacing certified playground mulch, decking, and the protective linking on the fence. The playground equipment needs to be reset. The 5th Avenue Park consists of replacing certified playground mulch and repairing damaged decking. The project is currently 90% complete.

Reconstruction of Roads and Sidewalks

Reconstruction and repair of damaged roads, curbing, sidewalks, parking lots, and any other associated roadways appurtenances in Seaside Park. The project is currently 50% complete.

Reconstruction of Administration Building

The project consists of reconstruction of the Administration Buildings in Seaside Park. The reconstruction will consist of replacement of the roofing system on the Borough Hall, Borough Hall Garage, and J-Street Water Treatment Plant. The project is 100% complete.

Furnish and Install Solar Powered Multi-Space Parking Meters

Project consists of the Replacement of regular parking meters with new Parking Meter Kiosks in Parking Lots. Seven Kiosk stations were installed. The project is 100% completed.

Reconstruction of the Lifeguard Station

The project consists of a temporary replacement of the Seaside Park Lifeguard Station. The project is 100% complete.

Super Storm Sandy Rapid Infrastructure Assessments

We developed a team and oversaw the operation of performing storm damage assessments for the Borough of Seaside Park. The Borough has oceanfront and bay-front communities that were significantly damaged during the storm. Our team performed a full assessment of infrastructure, buildings and facilities, dwellings, and shoreline facilities including the beach, the boardwalk, parks, bulkheads, and marina and piers. The project is 100% complete.

Water Meter Removal & Replacement

Following the storm, water meters were removed from the entire Borough of Seaside Park Properties. About 90% of the meters have now been reinstalled.

Substantial Damage Assessments

Using the FEMA Hazardous program, substantial damage assessments of residential properties in the Borough f Seaside Park were performed resulting in over 75 substantial damage letters being produced from the outcome of the assessments. The assessments are 100% complete.

Hazardous Mitigation Grant Program

We submitted a letter of intent for different projects under the hazardous mitigation grant program. The projects would mitigate different facilities against future storms. The applications are currently at the state, pending approval.

Reconstruction of 14th Avenue Pier

This project would included the full reconstruction of the pier. The design was complete and awarded in April. On July 31st we received a letter from the contractor that informed us that they could not complete the job as proposed and requested the contract to be terminated. The project will be re-advertised during the month of August.

The Borough of Seaside Park adopted the budget on June 23, 2013 for the calendar year 2013. The final Tax rate is 1.253, a slight decrease from last year, 1.254. The Municipal tax rate is presently at 0.425, from 0.429 in 2012; this represents the fourth year with no municipal tax increase. The final Tax Rate reflects the inclusion of funds from FEMA through the Community Disaster Loan Program, geared to help those communities with projected losses in revenue due to Hurricane Sandy.

Moody's Investors Services, which provides credit ratings and research, has been keeping a close look at all the municipalities affected by Super storm Sandy. Moody's has advised the Borough of Seaside Park that we are one of the few communities to maintain

the same rating as pre-Sandy, which is A1. Back in August of 2008, Moody's assigned A3 rating to the Borough of Seaside Park, since then, they have upgraded us to A1 rating.

The Annual Audit for the calendar year ending 12/31/2012 has been performed and finalized by Fallon & Larsen LLP. The Borough of Seaside Park received a clean audit, in addition, the audit showed that all the financial statement disclosures were neutral, consistent, and clear.

Our Finance Office continues to work with FEMA in regards to the claims related to Hurricane Sandy.

The spring of 2013 brought a huge challenge to the staff and volunteers of the Seaside Park Marina. As with all the other municipal departments, Super Storm Sandy left us with a major rebuilding effort. In addition to the regu-

lar seasonal preparations we had many storm related tasks to complete before the marina could be open for business. The yard was filled with debris and damaged boats, the south dock looked more like a roller coaster than a place to moor boats, all of the electrical power pedestals had to be replaced because of being submerged, the office and bathrooms sustained severe damage, and the marina vehicle was soaked in over 30 inches of water.

With the help of the municipal engineer and competent contractors we have been able to recover to about ninety percent of our normal status for this time of year. Unfortunately, we lost many of our good friends because of lost or damaged vessels or the added expense of having to repair their homes. We have also gained many new friends who lost their place to dock their boats because of the marinas that will not be open this season

due to damage.

The marina still has slips available for boats up to 25 feet in length, so if you have been considering using our marina this would be a good time to join us. Please contact the Borough Hall and request a Boat Slip Rental Application.

I would personally like to thank the regular marina patrons for being so patient while we were in the process of rebuilding. I know the inconveniences were trying at times but be assured that we made every effort to get things back to normal as quickly as possible. By next season we will be in better condition than we ever were and the season of 2013 will be just a mem-



The grace period for the 2013 3rd Quarter, which is due August 1, 2013, has been extended to September 6, 2013. Payments must be received on or before September 6, 2013. Interest will be calculated back to August 1, 2013 on payments received after September 6, 2013.

Repairs continue on Well #8 and Well #10.

Following the storm, water meters were removed from the entire Borough of Seaside Park Properties. About 90% of the meters have now been reinstalled.

Meters will be read on or about August 15th.

In September the NJDOT will begin Route 35 water & sewer improvements to the roadway.

In October, we will be flushing hydrants during the daylight hours. Flushing the water mains allows us to test the hydrants and it also improves water quality.

Seaside Park Environmental Committee

The Committee is continuing its efforts to become a Sustainable New Jersey municipality, and will look forward to the Green Day Fair as well as other educational events in 2014.

Beach badges, Daily boat ramp and seasonal boat ramp passes can be purchased at our 14th Avenue Bay location from 6am-3pm. Our 5th Avenue Bay Beach also

sells badges for the bay beach use, also needed for fishing and Crabbing off the 5th Avenue pier. These hours are 10am-3pm. Badges may also be purchased outside the Police Station 10am-3pm.

Badges must be prominently displayed on the person for entry to our beaches, 7 days a week. There are two red bagged parking meters conveniently located at the corner of the bathhouse on Ocean Avenue for 15 minute increments to purchase beach badges at the bathhouse window. We hope you have

Smoke detectors have a life span of approximately five to seven years. After this time, they should be replaced.

Be certain your home address numbers are visible from the street. This is important so emergency vehicles can find your home quickly.

Storm Sandy is long gone, but still very fresh in our memories. Everyday someone in our small community is faced with decisions caused by the storm. Our office has relocated to the elementary school on 4th and Central Avenues. Please obtain access on the 4th Avenue side door. Our phone Number is 732-793-5100. As a result of the storm several key elements in the Code Office have been revised, namely, our new location on 4th and Central, and the formation of our own Uniform Construction Office lead by Robert Nora, the Construction Official. We no longer have shared services with Berkeley Township. Another change was providing a Flood Plain Manager, who is Felipe S. Contreras, PE with Remington Vernick and Vena at 732-286-9220; he will answer all elevation questions concerning the FEMA flood maps.

Jim Anderson, Zoning Officer, can answer zoning issues and questions. He is available Tuesday and Thursday from 7:00AM-2:30PM and also on Fridays from 7:00AM-1:00PM. Code Enforcement also works out of the new location. Elaine Broyles is our Code Enforcement Officer. Elaine will be available Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Fridays from 8:00AM-4:00PM.

Rental, mercantile, sidewalk, driveway, curb replacement, garbage sales, 4x4 beach permits, title transfers, and bulk trash permits are obtainable from this office. The Construction Permit paper work is also available, such as building, plumbing, electrical, fire and zoning permits. A Zoning Permit is required for every Construction Permit and in most cases surveys are required.

<u>Funtown Peers: Friends of Seaside Park, Inc.</u> <u>Grant Disbursement</u>




